The vacancies in Hull are full and part-time but only in secondary schools.

School-Home Support is a child centred organisation and SHS Workers can be pivotal in tackling underachievement in the most disadvantaged children and young people. Through the development of good working relationships, you will facilitate their full access to educational opportunities and assist in overcoming any barriers to learning.

As you will be expected to have substantial, un-supervised and daily contact with children, young people and often their families, it is absolutely essential that you have considerable experience in an education, social work, youth or community work field. You will need to demonstrate understanding of both the social and emotional factors which can affect a child's capacity to learn, as these are key to the role of a SHS Worker.

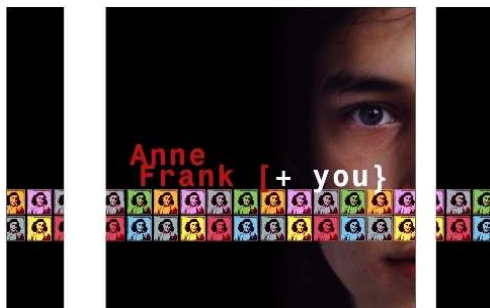
