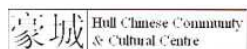

Funding Opportunity — Comic Relief Grants

Deadline: 29 February 2008

Comic Relief operates a number of grant schemes through its Red Nose Days funding programme and has announced that the next application deadline for grants over £5,000 is 29 February 2008.

Grants are available through six programme areas. These are:

- Young people
- Older People
- Mental Health
- Domestic Violence
- Refugees & Asylum Seekers
- Disadvantaged Communities



The grants programme is open to registered charities and constituted community and voluntary groups and grants are made for between one and three years. Although there is no maximum grant size Comic Relief are likely to make grants of between £15,000 and £40,000 per year.

for those people affected by flooding. A system is now in place whereby groups can apply for up to £1000 per

activity. A weekly panel, comprising Hull CVS staff, along with community workers, for example, will assess each application on its appropriateness and value for money. Hull CVS will be responsible for the administration and distribution of monies.



A pilot is currently underway involving 12 groups in the city. Once there is confidence that a robust system is in place, it will be run citywide, advertising widely. In the mean time, for more information, please contact the HANA office on 491177.

HANA's primary aim is to promote the well being of BME communities in the Hull and East Riding Area by providing a voice and advocate on their behalf, and by representing their interests in the range of influential or decision-making contexts. This role is supported by capacity-building amongst BME groups, signposting and referral on the one hand and engagement with partnership bodies on the other.

We aim to be of service to BME communities by facilitating consultation and feedback on issues which affect them and by conducting research into subjects which concern them, and particularly into local service provision to identify obstacles which may make take-up difficult for BME people.

Broadband Internet Connections for HANA Members!

K A R O O

HANA has funds to pay for a one year broadband internet connection for your organisation or group. The process is simple and is open to all HANA member groups. If the group or organisation has an office or building, the connection would go there. If you do not have an office and you are a constituted group member of HANA, then you need to hold a meeting with your committee and decide where the connection should be set up. We would need a copy of your minutes for this meeting.

Then you need to contact the HANA office and we will confirm if you are eligible for the connection. We need, in writing, what the connection will be used for, who will have access to the connection (eg. Group members and staff, members of the community etc...) and how you feel your group will benefit from the connection.

Once you have received a confirmation from us, you will need to contact Karoo to arrange a business broadband account and connection, and request to pay for the whole year at the beginning. On receipt of the invoice, HANA will issue a cheque to cover the cost of your groups internet connection for a whole year!
