**HANA is looking for a suitable candidate for the position of Hate Crime Project Worker and Researcher for our Open Up Project. This role will include the following:**

- To provide an advocacy service, to all victims of Hate Crime.
- To build the capacity of HANA by increasing the membership and participation of Black and Minority Ethnic Organisations.
- To be the first point of contact for all those wishing to report Hate Crime. To manage all reports from start to finish, to liaise with the police and all other agencies on behalf of the client.
- Promote services available to victims, and engage with them, keeping all victim groups informed of the services available to them.
- Offer advice and advocacy for the victims of hate crime. Enabling them to receive the best possible service from the police and statutory agencies.
- Actively encourage the reporting of hate crime, by assisting victims in filing reports.
- To encourage co-operation and sharing of information and best practices among the BME organisations.
- Research into possible funding and identify suitable funding streams to further sustain HANA's work tackling hate crime and other projects.
- Research into and write reports on topics on a range of issues.

## Funding opportunity - Youth Opportunity Fund - Round 2

Youth Opportunity and Youth Capital Funds are BACK! Submit your applications for funding. You can apply for a small or large YOF grant £250 - £7,500. You can apply for £2,500 and over for 'things' or 'places' from YCF.

- Capital items now include equipment or facilities in projects of £2,500 or over. Single items costing less than £1,000 are not considered 'capital'.
- You can apply for the small YOF grants twice and the larger YOF or YCF grants once a year.
- If you work together with other large groups of young people you may be able to apply for much larger grants e.g. use £25,000 YCF and £10,000 YOF to have mobile provision in an agreed area or run a large summer activity programme.

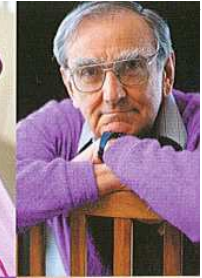
**National Youth Agency (NYA)** is looking to set up a Young Muslim Advisory Group (YMAG).

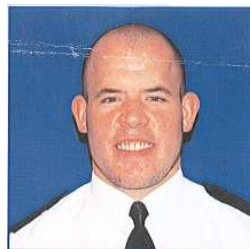

NEW BODY TO EXAMINE HEALTH  
AND SOCIAL CARE SERVICES



Hull City Council has awarded Hull CVS a three-year contract to develop Hull's new LINK (Local Involvement Network). CVS are now recruiting local people and groups to join the LINK.

Hull LINK will be an independent network of individuals and voluntary and community groups looking at health and social care services provided by the NHS, City Council, private companies and charities.

LINKs are being set up throughout England and will have powers to investigate and lobby on issues of concern, make reports to providers and to inspect some types of premises where services are delivered. A key part of LINKs' role is to listen to local people about their experiences of services.
