Small grants for voluntary sector good practice events

Grassroots Grants - Hull CVS



Hull CVS has been awarded a three year grant to become a Grassroots Grants Local Funder by the Community Development Foundation who manage the fund on behalf of the Office of the Third Sector. They will be working alongside York and North Yorkshire Community Foundation who have been awarded a similar grant to deliver Grassroots Grants in the East Riding of Yorkshire.

Eligible groups must be:

- not for profit, volunteer-led voluntary or community groups that have been in operation for not less than 12 months and are connected with, or meeting the needs of, their local community.
- groups with an income not exceeding £20,000 a year (as an average over the past three years);
- groups with a governing document such as a constitution (guidance and support will be offered to groups without one).

The Key Fund is a Community Development Finance Institution (CDFI), which aims to provide loans and investments community owned organisations working in disadvantaged communities in Yorkshire and Humberside. The following may be eligible to apply:

- A voluntary and community organisation seeking to develop ideas for generating their own income.
- An individual or group starting up a Social Enterprise.
- A Social Enterprise looking to grow and develop.
- A Social Firm employing a significant number of disabled staff who uses income generated by the provision of goods/services to pursue a social mission.
- A Credit Union or other community saving and credit scheme.
- A Cooperative, where a groups of individuals with shared economic, social and cultural goals form a jointly owned and democratically controlled enterprise.

Hull City Council has been working to make changes to recruitment and selection. Here are some examples of the work that we have been doing.

We have signed up to an organisation called NARIC. NARIC compare qualifications gained in other countries to British qualifications and we can now compare qualifications from over 180 countries worldwide. This is to ensure we accept qualifications gained in different countries.

The job application has changed. The personal statement section has been divided up so that it is easier to write about your skills, knowledge and experience. We have made changes to the references section. We now accept references from community or voluntary group members or leaders.

People said that we need to advertise our jobs in different places. We are working with HANA and other community groups to make this happen. When we have more information, we will let you know. We have also been working with Adult Education so that our jobs can be advertised in the centres across the city.

We are arranging Workshops for people to find out more about Hull City Council and the recruitment and selection process. They are free to attend, for more information contact Sarah McGowan on 613225. We hope to see you there!

Open Up: Hate Crime Project & Research



What is Hate Crime?

A Hate Crime is any offence against a person or property that is perceived by the victim or any other person as being motivated by prejudice or hate of a person's:

- Race
- Age
- Religion
- Disability
- Sexual Orientation
- Gender

Hate Crime can take many forms, including: physical attacks, murder, damage to property, verbal abuse, intimidation, bullying, arson and offensive graffiti or offensive literature.

Hate Crime can happen to anyone. If you have been a victim of hate crime or have witnessed a hate crime incident, please come to one of our surgeries on the dates and venues mentioned on the next page. We want to raise awareness and understanding of hate crime, and encourage its reporting either directly to the police or through our Hate Crime Reporting Centre.
